

Parent/Carer Sport Survey Results June 2022

We had 131 responses to the survey, representing 174 pupils.

Q1. What year group is your child in? Make multiple selections if appropriate.



Q2. What sporting clubs has your child attended?

All clubs have been well attended. Some children did not get a place as the clubs were oversubscribed, especially for KS1 multi-sports.


Q3. If your children did not attend a sports clubs, why not?

Four respondents said their child did not like the clubs offered, while eleven said the clubs clashed with other clubs outside of school.


However, some of the other comments noted the following:

- Difficulties in managing pick ups
- No clubs being available in EYFS
- Some parents were unaware of the clubs on offer
- Not being able to get a space in the KS1 multi-sports club

Q4. Has your child represented the school in a sporting competition this year?




Q5. What other after sports clubs would you like Sketchley Hill to offer?



Other requested clubs were: gymnastics, dance, yoga, KS2 dodgeball, KS2 multi-sports, aerobics, rounders, basketball, table tennis, tennis, martial arts.

A few respondents requested swimming. However, due to the lack of facilities, this cannot be considered.

Q6. Would you be willing to pay for sports clubs run by external, qualified sports coaches?



Summary of other comments not covered above:

- The majority of respondents felt the provision at Sketchley was good and that their children had enjoyed the sports clubs
- one respondent wanted to know what was covered in school PE lessons

- one respondent felt we could do more to make clubs more inclusive to children with additional needs, such as ADHD
- one respondent was critical of how PE lessons are run at Sketchley

Conclusions:

- better promotion/communication of available clubs is required
- parents would like to see sports clubs for EYFS pupils
- parents would like to see a broader range of activities and are willing to pay for clubs run by external providers
- children and parents would like more opportunities for pupils to represent the school in sporting competitions

These results are to be taken into account when reviewing and completing the action plan for the next academic year.
