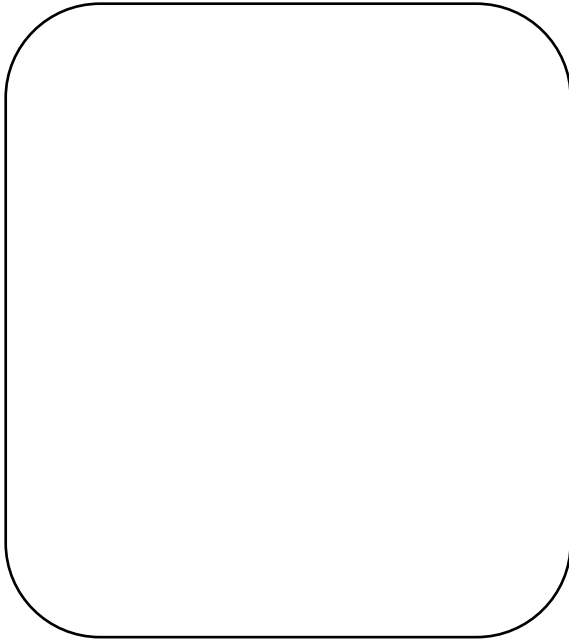

- Detailed description about the missing pet including appearance and personality
- The reward given if the pet is found
