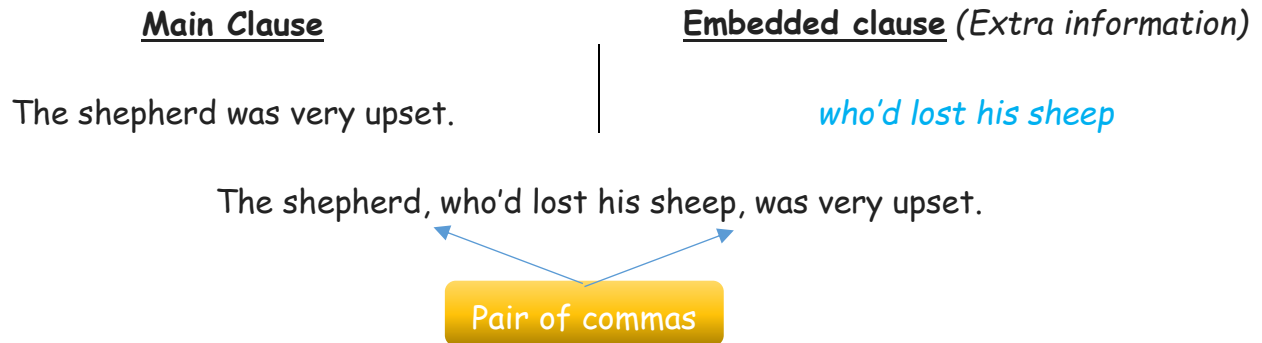


Grammar: Parenthesis using commas

Parenthesis – What does it mean?

Parenthesis is a **word, phrase or sentence** that is put in writing as **extra information** or an **afterthought**. It is separated from the rest of the sentence by a **pair of punctuation marks**.
