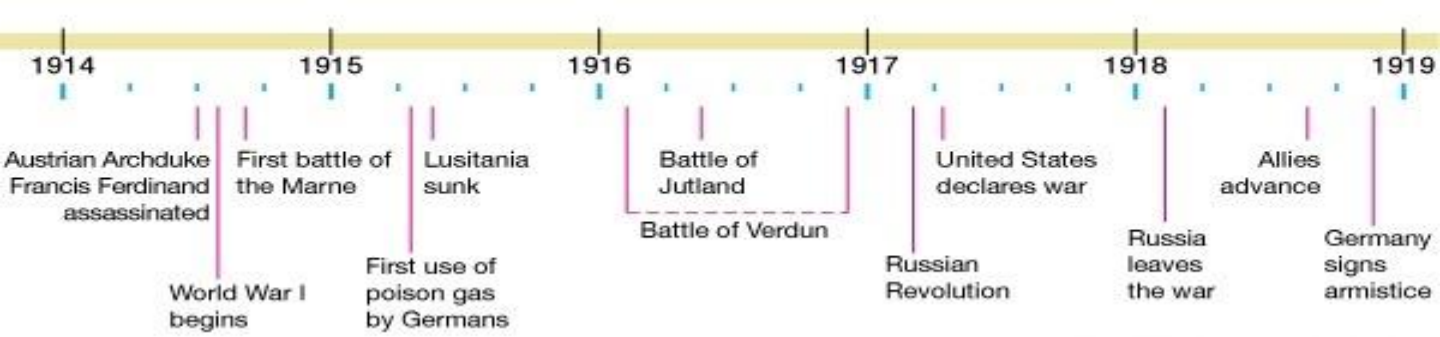


History – What was it like to be a soldier in WW1?



Chief Events of World War I, 1914–18



armistice An agreement made by countries to stop fighting	artillery Large guns used to fire shells at the enemy	allies Countries that fight together	casualty A person injured or killed in war
civilian An ordinary person who is not a soldier	front The line along which armies face each other	infantry An army unit of soldiers who fight on foot	munitions Military supplies including weapons

Features of a Biography

- Third person
- Significant events in time order
- Past tense
- Quotes
- Adverbials of time to link ideas
- Recalled like a story (not a list of facts)
- Opening & closing statements

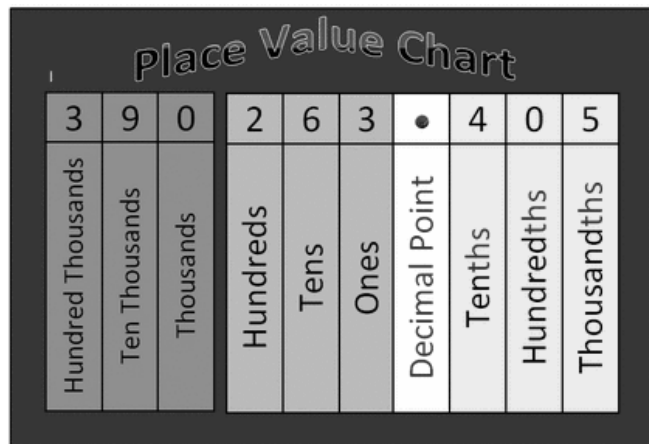
Autobiographies

- Similar to biographies in style
- Written in the first person

Stories with a flashback

- Flashbacks are descriptions of memories
- Flashbacks have a trigger e.g. a sound, smell, image etc.
- Characters and settings could be different in the flashback
- Verb tenses can vary

Methods

Column addition & subtraction

$$\begin{array}{r} 38 \\ 93 \\ \hline 131 \end{array}$$

$$\begin{array}{r} 6712 \\ 56 \\ \hline 16 \end{array}$$

Column multiplication & short division

$$\begin{array}{r} 237 \\ \times 4 \\ \hline 948 \\ 12 \end{array}$$

$$186 \div 6 = 31$$

no groups of 6 can be made

3 x 6 = 18

1 x 6 = 6
