





Practice papers will continue to be sent home and it is an expectation that pupils complete their own revision on gaps as identified in these.


Spelling logs can be taken home at any point and the Year 6 word list is downloadable from the VLE.

After the Easter break we will be sending home some of the books that we have been using in school so that they can be used as revision aids.


